Write a story using these prompts:

## 1. The Missing Library Book

Write a story about a student who discovers that their overdue library book has mysteriously vanished from their bedroom. ## 2. A Day When Objects Float

Remember to include dialogue and describe how different family members react.

#### 3. The New Student

Create a story about your class getting a new student who seems different from everyone else - they never eat lunch, have an unusual accent, and sometimes appear to glow faintly. Write about how you discover their extraordinary secret. Focus on building suspense and developing the character.

#### 4. Trading Places with Your Pet

Write about magically switching bodies with your pet for a day. Describe what it feels like to be in your pet's body, what you learn about your pet's daily life, and any adventures or challenges you face. Don't forget to include how you switch back!

### 5. The Last Day of Summer

On the final day of summer vacation, you find a map in your grandparents' attic that leads to something exciting in your own neighborhood. Write about your journey following the map
