All the other 21 letters are called consonants.

We use 'a' with a consonant. Example- *a pencil, a tree*

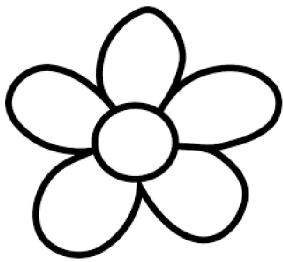
We use 'an' with a vowel. Example- *an egg, an umbrella*

A and **an** suggest any one person or thing.

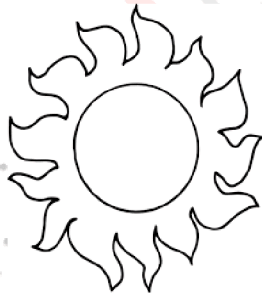
